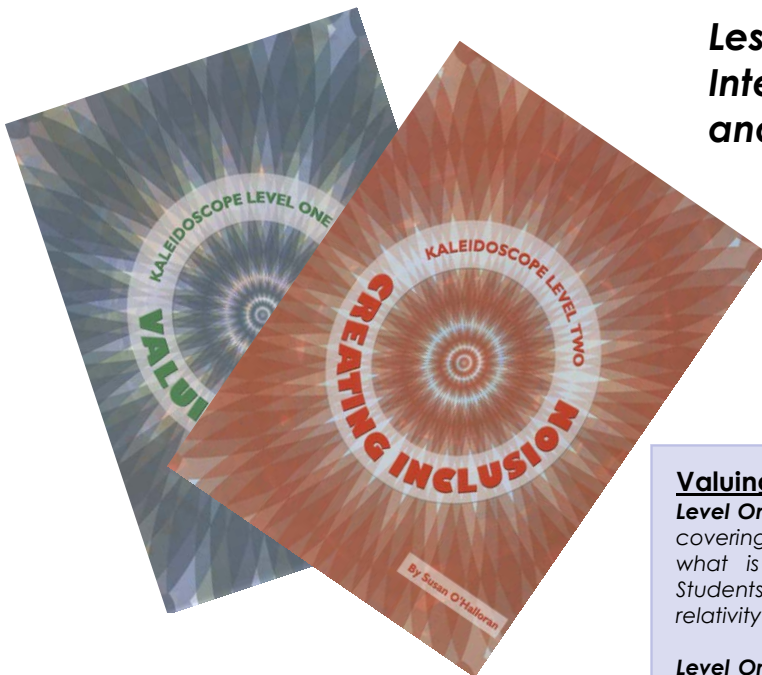

Kaleidoscope: Valuing Difference & Creating Inclusion seeks to aid students in developing values, behaviors and skills that will help them to create more inclusive schools as they study, work and live in an increasingly diverse world (Appropriate for Junior High through Adults with college and adult groups adding age-appropriate examples).

Consisting of 21 units in all (50 minutes per unit) plus scores of additional ideas on each unit's theme, the curriculum can be taught once a week or as an entire semester's course. Levels 1 and 2 has been tested in several pilot schools in the Chicagoland over a four year period. The curriculum includes over 40 video-story segments with adults and high school students from every walk of life. In addition, a team of educators have developed measurement and assessment tools to accompany the curriculum.

The Kaleidoscope curriculum can be used as a stand-alone course on learning and exploring diversity. In addition to this direct approach, the "Additional Ideas and Resources" sections guide teachers in integrating the units' themes and subjects into other disciplines in a school's curriculum and community life.

Valuing Differences

Level One Valuing Differences is consists of 9 units covering basic definitions such as: what is culture? what is diversity? what is "the melting pot"? Students explore awareness of identity, cultural relativity and conflict resolution.

Level One stresses the importance of creating an inclusive school environment where everyone feels respected and appreciated, and where the school community engenders a sense of belonging for all.

Creating Inclusion

Level Two Creating Inclusion contains 12 units that examine the psychological as well as the social and economic reasons behind stereotyping and discrimination.

During project activities, students uncover their own prejudices and exclusive behaviors. Students are guided into creating action-plans that prompt them to practice inclusive behaviors, and to develop guidelines for becoming active citizens. This level ends with videotaped stories of success — adults and students from all walks of life talk about how they are working to create a more inclusive world.
